Our last show was not only memorable for celebrating our 30th Birthday, it was also, for me, tinged with nostalgia and a little sadness. For almost as long as the school has existed I have had one of my own children attending classes and 'Time Bandits' was my daughter, Gemma's, last performance as a pupil in the school.

I feel that the school has been so successful over the years because we are family based, connecting with all families, from grannies to tiny tots! It was wonderful last Saturday to be able to call upon family members to help our young ones learn new steps. Filling the gym we glided through the 'vine step' and I saw with great pride how the children quickly mastered it with the extra help! Similarly, our Tuesday Baby Class has wonderful mums and dads who regularly gallop and skip across the floor with little ones in tow and who helped our pre-beginners in their recent medal test, giving our children that added confidence to perform brilliantly!

All four of my own children have been nurtured by the school and have benefited from experiencing the joy of performance. My eldest daughter, Sarah, reminisced about her first performance as a 3-year old baby owl at the Joseph Rowntree Theatre. Unfortunately, we hadn't rehearsed with the special moving cloud effect, so as Sarah lead her little flock of chicks onto the stage she was enthralled by the clouds, turning her back on the audience to watch the amazing effect, whilst all the other little owls following her, piled up in a heap on the floor! In the same vein, my second daughter Nina, was so excited about performing that she needed to go to the toilet, ran off the stage and missed her big speech and my son Benjamin had a giggling fit on stage with his friend, bringing the show to a standstill... As a family we have so many funny and fond school memories.

Now, Gemma has chosen to follow her love of dance further, and has accepted a place at Northumbria University. I am proud that the School has given her a good grounding for the hard road ahead. Also congratulations to Elise Hart who has won a place at the Northern School of Contemporary Dance - natural talent and good teaching have helped Elise and I wish to reiterate to parents, that it is essential for our students to receive the 'correct' training if they wish to take their interest to higher levels. I am proud to say that our School's work has been the backbone for many students who have furthered their career in dance.

Just after the show, I met the mother of two of our students in Tesco's and she was full of praise for everyone and admitted shedding a few tears after the final show as it would be the last time her daughters would be dancing those particular dances and although she knew that they would be ready for the next stages, she felt sad. I knew exactly what she meant! I always feel a little sad when a show is over and especially when my own baby is about to fly the nest.

I shall always keep with me the memory of Gemma prancing around on the side of the stage, displaying to me her new 'Brigit Jones' big pants, making me laugh before going on! Very different from her first performance as a "first year elephant" (first year infant) and Fuchsia Flower when before going on she looked up at me and asked... "Do they have worms in heaven Mummy?"




